

Physician Information Sheet For Allergy and Other Injection Orders



Allergy Immunotherapy

Allergy immunotherapy is administered by the Wilce Student Health Center in accordance with the written and signed orders of the patient's physician. The online form "***Administration of Allergen Immunotherapy***" serves as these written and signed orders. Your patient will not be seen or evaluated for this problem by the Wilce Student Health Center physicians, although a patient may schedule an appointment for the purpose of receiving symptomatic treatment. Our nurses have standing orders for emergency situations in the event of adverse reactions. Should such a problem arise, our physicians are available for appropriate emergency treatment.

Allergen vials can also be sent with the patient to our facility. These vials are stored by our Injection Nurse, and the patient may request that vials be released to them as needed for injections during times away from the university. If a patient fails to appear for injections for more than 90 days, the vials will be placed on hold and either returned to the ordering physician or discarded.

Other Medication Injections

Wilce Student Health Center requires an assessment by one of our providers for the administration of other injectable medications. Students receiving ongoing medication injections are advised to schedule an appointment with a provider by calling (614) 292-4321. Documentation of the underlying diagnosis and previous treatment will be needed, and the patient should have that information available at the time of their appointment with our provider. For certain high-risk injectable medications, the provider may need to refer the patient to an appropriate local consultant for further evaluation and/or administration of that medication.
